

He goes and tells the Old Man. Chang is rescued and then recovers quickly.

Some time later, the boys are again playing near the well. This time, the older brother falls in. Chang runs to their mother and tries to tell her that "TikkiTikkiTembo-no Sa Rembo-chari Bari Ruchi-pip PeriPembo has fallen into the well." At first she cannot hear him so he says it again. However, because Chang is out of breath from running he sputters and then mispronounces the name. His mother insists that he repeat the name—but with respect. He tries repeatedly until finally his mother tells Chang to get the Old Man with the Ladder. Chang goes to the Old Man with the Ladder. Initially, the old man does not respond because he is asleep. Further, when Chang tries to wake him up, the Old Man with the Ladder—annoyed—tries to fall back asleep. After Chang breathlessly repeats his brother's predicament the Old Man goes with Chang to save his brother from the well. They get TikkiTikkiTembo-no SaRembo-chari Bari Ruchi-pip PeriPembo from the well, but because of the long time he was in the well, it was many moons before he was quite the same again.
